Ridlington Annual Parish Meeting

15th May 2024 6pm

1. Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting 10th May 2023

These were approved by the meeting and signed by the Chairman.

2. Matters arising

David Roome suggested that bins, particularly if they are used to dispose of dog waste, should be in strategic locations and well away from residential properties and benches. It was suggested that bins should be lidded. The start of Green Lane was suggested as a suitable location. The clerk confirmed that all bins provided by Rutland County Council are 'dual purpose' and will be emptied by the council's contractor. The cost of bins and their installation would be funded by the Parish Council.

Shelagh Johnson explained a residents' idea to improve and make a feature of the bus shelter with some maintenance and planting. Permission for this would be sought from the Parish Council. Dependent on the work intended a licence to cultivate or planning consent may be required from Rutland County Council. Confirmation of cover may also be required from the Parish insurers. John Morrell suggested commissioning an artwork, depicting Ridlington, for display in the bus shelter.

3. Parish Council Chairman's report

The Chairman's report was read by John Morrell – attached below.

4. Village Hall report and accounts

Village Hall Committee report and accounts were summarized by David Roome, noting healthy finances and the submission of the annual return to the Charities Commission. Fund raising this year has consisted of 4 coffee mornings and one social event generating, with hall hire, an income of £836.

5. Playing Field report and accounts.

Playing Field report and accounts were read by Ruth Lees, noting the role of the trustees. The most pressing issue remains the management and removal of unsafe trees.

6. Ward Member

County Councillor Giles Clifton reflected on his first year as a County Councillor representing the Braunston and Martinsthorpe Ward and the 15 parishes within it. He noted the making of Edward Baines an Honorary Alderman of Rutland County Council. Cllr. Clifton proposed a Rutland Farming motion in March to encourage Rutland County Council to recognise local producers. Cllr. Clifton sits on the planning & licensing committee, constitution commission, and Rutland Water partnership. He described his role as to champion the wishes and requirements of Ridlington to Rutland County Council.

7. AOB

Portrait of the King – it was confirmed that the Parish Council's official portrait of the King will be donated to and hung in the village hall.
